Painted Pleats Scarf

Designed by Laurie Day ® The Sweater Hag

Using knit, and purl stitches along with paired decreases and yarn overs, lovely little pleats are created

Use a self striping yarn and the pleats become painted.

Once started the 14 row pattern is easily memorized.



Skill Level: easy peasy Materials: Standard Yarn Weight Super fine #1 2 balls 100g / 3.5 oz 412 m / 447 yards KNITTING GAUGE: on ball band

7.5 sts = 1", 3 mm / 3 (US) needle Gauge using 3.75mm / 5 (US) needle

One pleat approximately 1"

Abbreviations

k- Knit

p- Purl

k2tog- Knit two together

yo - yarn over

rep - repeat

Note: yarn used in picture Berroco Comfort Sock

Colour Stewart Island 1812

Pattern Multiple of 8 stitches plus 1

Row 1: (Right Side) *K6, k2 tog, yo; rep from *, end k1

Row 2: P1, * k1, p7; rep from *

Row 3: *K5, k2tog, yo, p1; rep from *, end k1

Row 4: P1, * k2, p6, rep from *

Row 5: *K4, k2 tog, yo, p2; rep from *, end k1

Row 6: P1 * k3, p5; rep from *

Row 7: *K3, k2 tog, yo, p3; rep from * end k1

Row 8: P1, * k4, p4, rep from *

Row 9: * K2, k2 tog, yo, p4, rep from * end k1

Row 10: P1, *k5, p3; rep from *

Row 11: * K1, k2 tog, yo, p5, rep from * end k1Row 12: P1, *k6, p2 rep from *

Row 13: *K2 tog, yo, p6, rep from * end k1

Row 14: P1, *k7, p1, rep from *

With 3.75mm / 5 US needles, cast on 81 stitches. Repeat rows 1-14 until desired length. End with row 14. Cast off with right side facing. Weave in ends. Do not block as this will flatten pleats.

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
